“I had a dream of equality for all Americans no matter what race or religion.”

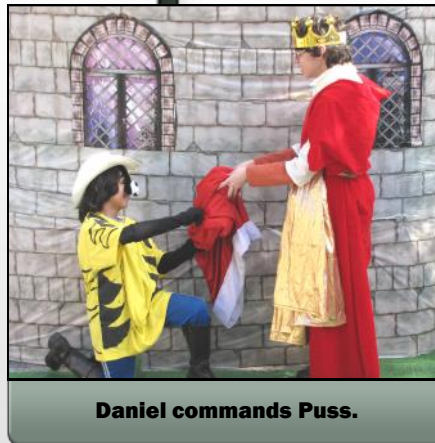
## Guest Speaker
